As co-founder and Director I created the vision and business plan and forged a pioneering collaboration between Bristol's two largest institutions in an entrepreneurial style and structure that was new to both. This involved securing stakeholder buy-in, raising £1.7m of public funds, gaining planning and listed building consent, a high-profile launch, growing the SRF team by 50% and installing full facilities management all within 11 months of writing the business plan. I have grown The Science Research Foundation to a £1m+ turnover, profitable subsidiary of the University including a five-fold increase in turnover within five years

The Science Research Foundation operates Engine Shed and the Bristol SETsquared Centre as two distinct business units.

As Centre Director, I marketed, operated and grew the Centre and managed delivery of support through in-house staff and partners and provided bespoke mentoring and support to early stage and serial entrepreneurs and CEOs of all ages. I have helped over 170 companies develop and implement strategies for growth, assisting them in raising over £168m of funding. Notable successes include [MyBuilder.com](#), [XMOS](#), [Tidal Generation](#), [Doc Com](#), [BrightPearl](#), [SecondSync](#), [UltraHaptics](#) and [BluWireless Technology](#) where significant growth has been achieved through analysis and selection of strategic options and effective board building. In 2008, the Centre was awarded 'Established Incubator of the Year' and in 2013 the "Best Designed Business Incubator" by [UKBI](#). In 2015, the 5 Centres of the Partnership were ranked best university-backed business incubator in the world by UBI. Bristol is the largest of the 5 Centres.

Motion Media PLC Board director (Ofex and LSE): 1996-2001 <i>Motion Media (“MM”) was set up by a group of 6 engineers, redundant from ST Microelectronics, to exploit technology in video compression. MM floated on Ofex in 1996, peaking at a market capitalisation of £270m, moved to the LSE in 2000 and then to AIM in 2002. In 2000 it acquired people, technology and offices of USA-based C-phone Corp. In 2004 it acquired a private Austrian company via reverse takeover, becoming SCOTTY Group PLC. The company became a world player in the development of video compression technology selling to over 40 countries using ISDN, PSTN and IP technology, utilising licensing, OEM and own-branded business models.</i>	My role as head of IT saw development of a hi-tech business to an integrated global company. As global head of HR I was responsible for enabling a people oriented business with rapid growth to 125 people followed by implementation of six problem-free redundancy programmes. I drove the Quality strategy for the company, promoting the concept of ‘people, products and processes’ as the components of an effective, entrepreneurial business. I had responsibility for Facilities , driving a complex sale and leaseback deal, a complex and successful dilapidations negotiation and implementation and over 2 years of managing underleases and running a business centre. I generated profit from the 30,000 sq ft. building by selling additional services and strict cost control. My responsibility for Manufacturing required liaison with multiple sub-contract manufacturers in the UK and USA and development of volume production plans and appropriate quality assurance processes. My final task at SCOTTY was to outsource the IT, HR and facilities management functions from the UK operation.
